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Frank Dattilio Ph.D., ABPP presents keynote at AAMFT Annual Conference in Austin



LVPCA psychologist Frank Dattilio gave a keynote address on Expanding the Horizons of MFTs Globally to 1500 mental health professionals at the annual conference of the American Association of Marriage and Family Therapy this past September in Austin, Texas. Dr. Dattilio's keynote focused on the various ways in which American Marriage and family therapists can exchange with other professionals throughout the world in promoting research, education, training and clinical practice. A highlight of his presentation involved beaming in marriage and family

therapy colleagues from India, Scandinavia, eastern Europe and Brazil, so the audience could get a firsthand look into the work that is being done in other countries. Dr. Dattilio also showed some of the research and educational projects that are underway in the United States, and how professionals here are collaborating with colleagues around the globe.

Dr. Dattilio is a leading couple and family therapist and is known for his development of the cognitive behavioral therapy model of treatment. He currently holds part-time faculty positions with Harvard Medical School's department of psychiatry and with the University of Pennsylvania's Perelman School of Medicine. He has published 300 professional articles and book chapters and 21 books in the areas of family therapy and psychological disorders. His works have been translated into 30 languages and are used in 80 countries. Dr. Dattilio has lectured on almost every continent and he is the recipient of numerous awards for outstanding achievement in psychology, psychotherapy and marriage and family therapy—including AAMFT's 2013 Outstanding Contribution to Marriage and Family Therapy.

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In Memoriam:

LVPCA Founding Member the Reverend Dr. John R. Tisdale December 10, 1932—November 28, 2015

Lehigh Valley Psychological and Counseling Association founding member, the Reverend Dr. John R. Tisdale, 82, of Slatington, passed away on November 28, 2015. Dr. Tisdale was a practicing psychologist, ordained minister, and Professor of Psychology Emeritus at Cedar Crest College. He earned his Ph.D. in Psychology and Pastoral Counseling from Boston University in 1961, and joined the faculty of Cedar Crest College as Chair of the Psychology Department in 1967 remaining in that position until late in his tenure, retiring in 1996. Also while on the faculty of Cedar Crest, he served as faculty representative to its Board of Trustees.

Dr. Tisdale was president of then Lehigh Valley Psychological Association in 1971 and 1979; and eventually served as Ethics Committee Chair. He was involved in governance of the American Psychological Association's Division 32/Humanistic Psychology (President in 1982-83), Division 36/Psychology of Religion and Spirituality (President in 1994-95), President of the Transpersonal Psychology Interest Group (1987-88) and Chair of the Committee of Division/APA Relations. He became an APA fellow in 1995, for "unusual and outstanding contributions to the field of psychology."

Dr. Tisdale also served as a research coordinator at the Pastoral Institute of the Lehigh Valley from 1967-72; was on the Board of Directors of the Lehigh Valley Child Guidance Clinic; was a marriage counselor at Gnaden Huetten Hospital; and consulted for then county MH/MR units. He authored over 40 articles and reviews and edited <u>Growing Edges in the Psychology of Religion</u>. Dr. Tisdale volunteered as an EMT and paramedic with several ambulances corps, taught first aid and CPR for the Red Cross and the American Heart Association, and was on the Board of Directors of the Eastern Pennsylvania Emergency Medical Services Council from 1978-84.

Dr. Tisdale surviving family include his wife Beverly (who graciously helped with this history); daughter Deborah Cozen and her family; sons Paul Tisdale and Erik Strohl.


