

Counseling Psychology Visiting Professor Position Announcement Lehigh University

Job Function: The Visiting Professor position in the Counseling Psychology program is a 1year, non-tenure track, Academic Year (9 months/year) position, renewable for a second year. This individual provides academic advising to students and coordinates the clinical training of future licensed professional counselors in our fully online Mental Health Counseling master's degree program. The Visiting Professor provides excellent teaching and supervision to future psychologists and counselors in the Counseling Psychology program, using culturallycompetent and social justice oriented pedagogies. The individual oversees, coordinates, and participates in the transition of existing courses in the Mental Health Counseling program, using Quality Matters principles, to develop online courses that provide a unified look and feel for students in the online Mental Health Counseling program.

Review of applications will begin on June 26, 2024 and will continue until the position is filled. Start date is August 2024.

Responsibilities:

- Teach courses equivalent to 9 credits in fall and 9 credits in spring semesters.
- Advise and supervise students in our online Mental Health Counseling program.
- Coordinate with the online program launch team in all aspects of launching the new program.
- Coordinate the admissions process, with Staff support, for the online Mental Health Counseling program.
- Organize and hold group meetings with students to provide information about practicum and internship.
- Organize group meetings on topics relevant to clinical training.
- Meet individually with students as needed, and provide mentoring and guidance regarding clinical training and career development.
- Attend Program Meetings, coordinate meetings with external stakeholders (practicum and internship supervisors), and establish relationships with clinical training sites).

- Coordinate Practicum and Internship placements for students in our online Mental Health Counseling program, including networking and developing new relationships with new training sites.
- Manage the contracts and training agreements with training sites and coordinate with Lehigh's Legal Office.
- Manage timely electronic collection (e.g., via Tevera) of supervisory evaluations and clinical hours at mid-semester and end of semester.
- Track student experiences at sites and post data regarding student experiences on Course Site.
- Recommend updates to the program manual and training materials as needed, and provide input and feedback to the overall training of students.
- Participate in student remediation, when needed.
- Other responsibilities as indicated by programmatic need and the Program or Training Director.

Required Qualifications:

- Ph.D. or Ed.D. in Counseling Psychology or related field
- Licensed Psychologist in PA or license eligible in PA
- Eligible for all state-mandated clearances, including FBI Federal Criminal history, Record (Act 114), Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Records Check (Act 34), Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance (Act 151) and Tuberculous clearance
- Experience with online education, preferred.
